

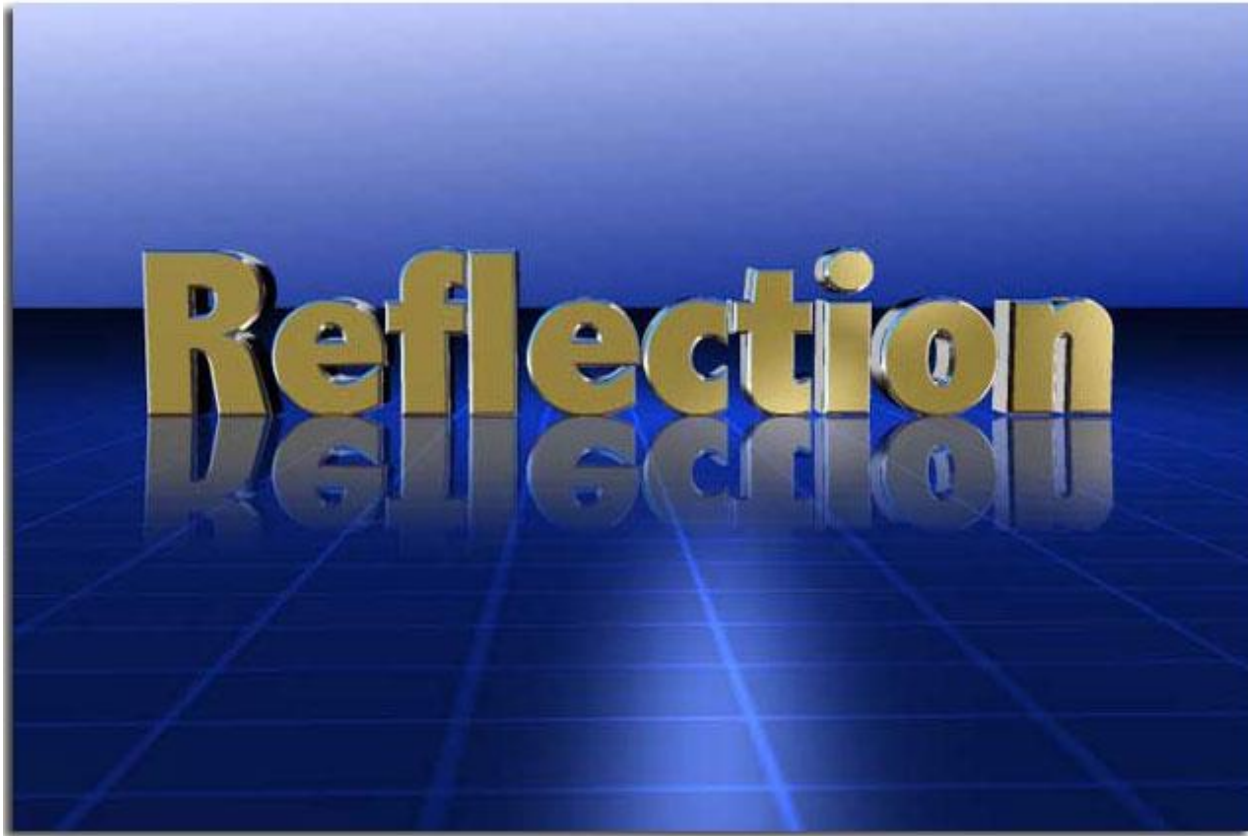

It isn't always the best policy

Role(s) of the artist

- Artist as director – “benevolent dictator” (!)
- Artist facilitating the creativity of others
- Middle ground
- Visibility of the artist
- Conceptual clarity and rigour

Markers of quality: by the artist

- Professionalism/rigour
- Listening
- Change in the artist

Markers of quality: in group dynamics

- Everybody takes part
- Length of relationship
- Participant choice

Markers of quality: in the work that is shown

- Aesthetics internal to the artform
- Subtlety
- Avoiding clichés

Markers of quality: audiences

- Audience reaction: are they enjoying it?
- Reaction to performance, composition and image

Practice that has worked: relationship building

- Listening and observation
- You don't have to start with 'making art'
- Provide an easy way in to your artform
- Respond to context
- Absurdity and playfulness
- Build a community of participants

Practice that has worked:

- You don't have to know everything
- The group has collective knowledge
- Participants are experts
- Provide examples of work you think is good
- Engage people in critical reflection on the work they make

Practice that has worked:

- Failure is Good
- Persistence is Crucial
- Make a Plan – Then Abandon It
- Enable people to make new identities
- Never assume you know
- Don't go with the first good idea

Role of participants	Participants in a process of creative enquiry, which they help to shape	Material for an artist's work	Role of participants
Authorship of the work	Co-authored, between artist and participants	Single-authored	Authorship of the work
Ethics of participation	Informed consent, plus on-going negotiation about the content and direction of the process	Informed consent	Ethics of participation
